Breakdown of Dormant Accounts Funding

Community Sports and Physical Activity Hubs

Dormant Accounts Funding will be allocated to establish 4 new Local Sports Partnership (LSP) led Community Sports and Physical Activity Hubs (Hubs) in 2024, with additional funding allocated to the 38 existing Hubs currently within the five year funding period 2020 - 2024. In addition, supplementary funding will be allocated to 6 Hubs currently outside of the five year funding period, for one year only, to strengthen the strategy for these Hubs to move towards a sustainable funding model. To date, Sport Ireland has funded 80 Hubs within the network of LSPs.

The objective of the Hubs is to bring local people together and provide a home for local clubs and sports organisations. The Hubs operate under three different models:

- 1. Community Sports Hub
- 2. School Community Sports Hub
- 3. Outdoor Community Sports Hub

Supported by Sport Ireland's network of LSPs, these Hubs provide information, support and advice on a wide range of sports and physical activities to make it easier for people in disadvantaged areas to get involved and engage in a more active and healthier lifestyle.

Training and Education

These training and education programmes will equip learners with versatile skills for both paid and voluntary roles, promoting personal development and providing participants with the knowledge, skills, and experience to support various roles within sports and physical activity settings.

Volunteer Supports

The Volunteer Supports initiative aims to identify and assist individuals volunteering in disadvantaged communities or with people with disabilities, helping them to gain leadership skills in community sport and physical activities (e.g., coaches, leaders, referees, committee members). This fund supports coaching and development programmes or other training opportunities. This funding stream is available to individuals volunteering in disadvantaged communities or with people with disabilities. It seeks to build participants' confidence and skillset, ultimately benefiting the community through the volunteer sport development efforts these individuals undertake.

Disability Training Framework

The 2024 Dormant Accounts Fund will enable Active Disability Ireland to continue working closely with Sport Ireland's network of LSPs. In addition, they will continue to build on the success of the Xcessible Programme supporting cultural changes across organisations.

Active Disability Ireland will also continue to progress their great outdoors project which aims to build capacity amongst individuals working in the outdoors environment to make it more inclusive and enhance the quality of sport and physical activity opportunities in the outdoors for people with disabilities.

Active Disability Ireland will work with young people with disabilities to develop a youth charter for change in the sports sector and an inclusive youth leadership programme. This initiative will guide the work of the sports sector while building future leaders in sport.

Sports Inclusion Disability Projects (SIDP)

The SIDP fund aims to reduce barriers to sports participation for people with a disability through minor infrastructure development, including handrails and fittings, and the provision of equipment, including pool pods and handcycles. This equipment or infrastructure aims to increase sports or physical activity participation for people with disabilities in their county.

2024 is the fifth funding cycle for Active Cities which is being delivered in the 5 largest cities in the Republic of Ireland, facilitated through 8 LSPs. The vision of an Active City is to:

- Create social norms about the benefits of sport and physical activity,
- Create programmes and opportunities for citizens of all abilities and ages,
- Work in partnership to increase physical activity,
- Create and maintain environments where sport & physical activity can flourish, ultimately working toward healthier lifestyles for their citizens.

Urban Outdoor Adventure Initiatives (UOAI)

The objective of the UOAI fund is to create opportunities for people living in disadvantaged communities to participate in outdoor adventure sports in urban settings. The programme also seeks to create new opportunities for at-risk youth in disadvantaged communities and people with a disability.

Opportunities for people living in urban communities to experience outdoor adventure sports are limited due to:

- Suitable natural environments,
- Distance from traditional outdoor settings for activities (forests, mountains etc.); and
- The need for equipment, supervision, training and support to engage in these sports.

The Her Moves Initiative aims to implement a systems change campaign through the creation of a brand, effective messaging, an online space and physical activity opportunities that give girls confidence and motivation, make them feel empowered to be active in their own way, to be excited about trying new sports/activities and to reframe what sport is all about. The fund is focused on supporting the development and piloting of programmes and initiatives that target reducing the drop out in sport and physical activity in adolescent girls.
